



From 1 April 2004, Assessment Level (AL) 4 school students aged 16 years or over who apply outside Australia for a student visa are required to provide the results of an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test, unless this requirement is waived. Special waiver provisions have been developed for applicants from the People’s Republic of China (PRC). These waiver provisions apply if the student is applying from China, excluding the Special Administrative Regions of Hong Kong and Macau.

An applicant must meet various criteria in order to be considered for waiver of the IELTS test requirement. An applicant can meet one of these criteria if they have obtained a satisfactory result in an English language proficiency test conducted under appropriate test conditions.
