Method of payment

In Australia

To make a payment, please pay by credit card, debit card, bank cheque or money order made payable to the Department of Immigration and Citizenship. Debit card and credit card are the preferred methods of payment.

Outside Australia

Before making a payment outside Australia, please check with the Australian Government office where you intend to lodge your application as to what methods of payment and currencies they can accept and to whom the payment should be made payable.

Fees

Fees are specified in the Australian Citizenship Regulations 2007.

Concession fee for Australian citizenship by conferral

A concession fee is payable by people in receipt of certain Centrelink and Department of Veterans' Affairs payments.

Centrelink

- Age (PCC, Code AGE or AGE BLIND);
• Carer Payment (PCC, Code CAR);
• Disability Support (PCC, Code DSP or DSP BLIND);
• Mature Age Allowance (PCC, Code MAA); and
• Wife (PCC, Code WFA, WFD or WFW).

A Centrelink card with the relevant payment code is generally sufficient evidence of eligibility for a fee concession.

Recipients of Special Benefit, Older Benefit-Parenting Payment Single or Partner Allowance with a letter from Centrelink confirming that they meet the requirements below.

- Special Benefit (HCC, Code SL). Must have been receiving Special Benefit for at least 46 of the previous 52 weeks.
• Older benefit recipients (PCC, Codes WDA, PPP, PPS, NSA, SAL, PTA or SPL). Must be over 60 years of age and in receipt of Widow Allowance, Parenting Payment, Newstart Allowance, Sickness Allowance, Partner Allowance or Special Benefit, for more than 9 months.
• Partner Allowance (HCC, Code PA). Must be the partner of a recipient of Age, Wife or Disability Support Pension, Carer Payment, Mature Age Allowance, or long term Special Benefit.

Department of Veterans' Affairs

Holders of a Pensioner Concession Card for Age Service, Invalidation Service, Income Support Supplement or Partner Service. The Concession Card is generally sufficient evidence of eligibility for a fee concession.

* Fee exemptions for Australian citizenship by conferral

No fee is payable by British and Maltese former child migrants who came to Australia between 22 September 1947 and 31 December 1967 under the Commonwealth Child Migration Scheme OR persons who have served for 90 days in the permanent forces of the Commonwealth of Australia.
