A. Lodged in Australia

To make payment in Australia, please pay by credit card, debit card in person or by bank cheque or money order made payable to the 'Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs' (the department). Please do **not** pay by cash or personal cheque.

B. Lodged outside Australia

For clients outside Australia, before you pay your application charge, please contact the Immigration office where you will be lodging your application to find out what methods of payment are accepted.

C. Lodged at a processing centre in Australia

Acceptable payment methods for applications lodged in Australia at a processing centre are:

- credit card;
- Australia Post money order made payable to 'DIMIA';
- bank cheque:
 - drawn on a bank with representation in Australia,
 - in Australian dollars, and made payable to the 'Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs'; or

 - drawn on a bank with representation in Australia,
 - in Australian dollars, and made payable to the 'Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs'.

Related costs

If your previous medical was less than 12 months ago, you may not have to undergo another.
- You must be required to undertake the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) test to determine your English language ability. The cost of this test is approximately A\$150 - A\$400, although this may vary from country to country. This cost is paid directly to the test centre.

Assurance of support

In certain migrant visa subclasses an Assurance of Support (AoS) is a mandatory requirement which must be met prior to visa grant. An assurance covers the principal applicant and other family members included in the application. Fact Sheet 34 explains the AoS scheme in more detail.

If you have applied for a visa with a mandatory AoS requirement, your assurer must also lodge a refundable bond with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia.

On 1 July 2004, Centrelink assumed responsibility for the assessment of AoS applications, including bond lodgement. The current bond amounts for visa subclasses with a mandatory AoS requirement are:

Primary applicant

Contributory Parent visa	\$10,000
All other visas	\$3,500

Other family members 18 years of age or over included in the application who must be covered by the bond

You should contact Centrelink on 132 850 for more information about the AoS scheme, including up-to-date bond amounts. Information is also available on the Centrelink website at www.centrelink.gov.au. Centrelink will advise when to lodge the bond(s) and how much must be deposited.

For applicants applying for a permanent Contributory Parent visa the AoS bond is held for 10 years from the date you arrive in Australia or, if you applied in Australia, from the date you were granted a permanent visa. All other AoS bonds are held for 2 years from the date you arrived in Australia, or if you applied in Australia, from the date you were granted a permanent visa.

Lodging the bond

The Commonwealth Bank of Australia will provide a bank guarantee to cover the AoS bond. It is the only bank approved to provide this service.

There are no charges for establishing bonds for Contributory Parent visa subclasses. For all other visas, the bank charges a fee for each bond to cover the cost of establishing and managing the bond. As the charge is not part of the bond, it is non-refundable. The bank does, however, offer a discount where 2 bonds are lodged at the same time by one person. Currently, the charge is A\$150 for the first bond and A\$50 for the second, a total of A\$200.

The bond operates as a term deposit. The bank guarantees to pay to the Australian Government any amount (up to the limit of the bond) redeemable by the Government under the AoS agreement. The initial period for the bond is:

- Contributory Parent visa 126 months;
- all other visas 30 months.

This represents the period the AoS is in effect (from the date of arrival in Australia or approval to stay in Australia) plus 6 months to cover the period between lodging the bond, approving the application and issue of the visa to travel to or stay in Australia.

Release of bond

Only Centrelink can authorise release of the bond. Release of the bond will depend upon whether the visa holder (the assuree) has claimed any recoverable Centrelink payments during the life of the AoS. After bond period the assurer should ask the nearest Centrelink office to release the bond money (less any claims by Centrelink).

For AoS cases accepted before 1 July 2004, a bond may be released by the department before the bond period begins if the person for whom the bond was paid:

- does not travel to Australia before cancellation or expiry of the visa;
- withdraws their visa application;
- is not accepted for permanent entry to, or stay in, Australia; or
- dies before the AoS comes into effect.

Adult Migrant English Program (AMEP)

User charging applies to AMEP English tuition. A flat annual administrative charge is required for the following Australian residents who arrived in Australia after 1 July 1991 and applied to:

- migrate before 1 January 1993;
- change their resident status before 1 January 1993;
- migrate after 1 January 1993 and were issued with a visa before 1 March 1993;
- change their resident status after 1 January 1993 and were granted permanent residence before 1 March 1993.

The charge is also payable by holders of 'gazetted' temporary visas.

The annual fee is:

Classroom or distance learning students	\$300
Informal learning (home tutor scheme or individual learning centre)	\$65

The annual fee administrative charge is only payable by persons who are not liable to pay the visa application charge. Exemption from payment of the charge exists under some circumstances.
