**NOTICE OF AGREEMENT WITH THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
FOR THE PURPOSES OF PARAGRAPH 3.10(5)(a) OF THE MIGRATION
REGULATIONS 1994**

I, *PHILIP RUDDOCK*, Minister for Immigration and Multicultural Affairs, acting under regulation 1.17 and paragraph 3.10(5)(a) of the Migration Regulations 1994 (“the Regulations”):

- (1) REVOKE the existing instrument made under regulation 148A of the Migration (1989) Regulations; and
- (2) NOTIFY that the Commonwealth had on 12 June 1991 entered into agreement with the United States of America in relation to the provision of information concerning international movement of air traffic and passengers on international flights, and that I am satisfied that the provision to that country of the information under that agreement would facilitate the handling of aircraft or of passengers travelling to destinations outside Australia.

[NOTES: (1) Regulation 1.17 provides that the Minister may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, specify matters which must be specified for the purposes of the Regulations.

(2) Paragraph 3.10(5)(a) provides that if the Commonwealth enters into an agreement with another country in relation to the provision of information concerning international movements of air traffic and passengers on international flights, the Minister must cause notice of the fact to be published in the *Gazette*.

(3) Regulation 148A of the Migration (1989) Regulations replicates regulation 3.10. Under paragraph 148A(5)(a) there was a requirement to publish the notice in the *Gazette*. This provision is the same in substance as paragraph 3.10(5)(a).

(4) This instrument takes effect from the date of publication in the *Gazette*.]
