EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

Australian Immigration Consolidated Statistics is produced by the Statistics Section of the Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs (DIMIA). It provides statistics on population, overseas arrivals and departures, temporary entrants in Australia, and the grant of permanent residence and citizenship.

Tables in Section 1 are derived from Census data and various Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) publications. Tables in Section 2 contain statistics of persons arriving in or departing from Australia and are based on data from the Travel and Immigration Processing System (TRIPS) supplemented from Incoming or Outgoing Passenger Card information. The statistics are consistent with those published by the ABS.

Tables in Section 3 and 4 contain statistics relating to departmental operations such as visa grants and conferrals of Australian Citizenship.

Categories of Movement

For statistical purposes the following categories of movement are used:

- permanent movement* - persons migrating to Australia and residents departing permanently;
- long term movement* - temporary visa holders arriving and residents departing temporarily with the intention to stay in Australia or abroad for twelve months or more, and the departure of temporary visa holders and the return of residents who had stayed in Australia or abroad for twelve months or more;
- short term movement* - travellers whose intended or actual stay in Australia or abroad is less than twelve months.

Definition of “Settler”

Settlers comprise persons arriving in Australia who hold permanent visas, regardless of stated intended period of stay, New Zealand citizens who indicate an intention to settle, and those who are otherwise eligible to settle (eg. overseas-born children of Australian citizens).

Migration and Humanitarian Programs

The Migration (non-Humanitarian) Program is made up of *Family Stream*, *Skill Stream* and *Special Eligibility* migrants. The Humanitarian Program is made up of *Refugee*, *Special Humanitarian* and *Special Assistance* migrants.

Eligibility Categories

Eligibility categories reflect both the Migration and Humanitarian Programs’ permanent visa sub-classes under which settlers entered Australia. In addition there are a number of categories of settlers which are not covered by the Migration or Humanitarian Programs.

The ***Family Stream*** consists of a number of categories under which a potential migrant can be sponsored by a relative who is an Australian citizen or a permanent resident of Australia. The Family Stream comprises the following categories:

- Spouse;
- Prospective marriage (fiancé);
- Child;
- Adoption;
- Parent (meeting the balance of family test);
- Aged dependent relative;
- Last remaining relative;
- Orphan dependent relative;
- Special need relative; and
- Interdependency.

From 1 July 1997 the Concessional category was moved to the Skill Stream and renamed Skilled Australian Linked to reflect changes to the requirements such as age and work skills as well as various sponsor attributes.

The ***Skill Stream*** component of the migration program is designed to contribute to Australia’s economic growth. It consists of a number of categories for prospective migrants where there is demand in Australia for their particular occupational skills, outstanding talents or business skills. These categories are:

- Skilled-Australian Linked* (from 1 July 1997, formerly Concessional Family) allows Australian citizens or residents to sponsor their parents, brothers, sisters, nephews, nieces and non-dependent children. Applicants must meet a points test which takes into account their age and work skills as well as various sponsor attributes;
- Regional Linked* allows sponsorship of skilled relatives to designated areas of Australia. Both applicants and sponsors must satisfy certain criteria;

- ❑ *Employer Nomination* for highly skilled people nominated by employers in Australia who have been unable to find or train skilled workers in Australia for the position. This includes the Labour Agreement category for people who are nominated by an employer or organisation under a Labour Agreement, Regional Headquarters Agreement or the Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme and who have the skills, qualifications, and experience required;
- ❑ *Business Skills* for successful business persons with established skills in business who have a genuine commitment to owning and managing a business in Australia;
- ❑ *Distinguished Talent* for people who have outstanding records of achievement in a profession, occupation, the arts or sport; and
- ❑ *Independent* for unsponsored applicants whose education, skills, English language ability and ready employability will contribute to the Australian economy.

There is also a *Special Eligibility* category which caters for other types of visaed settler arrivals within the Migration Program but not included in the Family or Skill Streams. These are:

- ❑ Former citizen of Australia;
- ❑ Former resident of Australia; and
- ❑ Family of New Zealand Citizen for dependents of New Zealand citizens who have settled or intend to settle permanently in Australia.

The offshore *Humanitarian Program* has three components:

- ❑ The *Refugee Program* which provides resettlement to Australia for people outside their home country subject to persecution in their home country;
- ❑ *Special Humanitarian Programs* (SHP) which comprise the In-country Special Humanitarian Program for people suffering persecution within their own country, and the Global Special Humanitarian Program for people who have left their country because of substantial discrimination amounting to a gross violation of human rights; and

- ❑ the *Special Assistance Category* (SAC) which embraces groups determined by the Minister for DIMIA to be of special concern to Australia and in real need, but who do not fit within other humanitarian categories. This program also assists those internally and externally displaced people who have close family links in Australia. This category was closed during the 2000-01 program year.

In addition there are some categories not covered by the Migration or Humanitarian Programs. These are:

- ❑ *New Zealand Citizens* which refers to the arrival of New Zealand citizens under the Trans-Tasman Travel Arrangement; and
- ❑ *Other* which refers primarily to the arrival in Australia of children born to Australian citizens overseas. It also includes residents of Cocos (Keeling) Islands, Norfolk Island etc, and persons granted Australian citizenship overseas.

Temporary Entry

Temporary Entry refers to the type of visa held. The three main categories of Temporary Entry are:

- ❑ Students
 - persons approved for entry into Australia for a specific period for the purpose of undertaking formal or non-formal study;
- ❑ Temporary Residents
 - persons approved for non-permanent entry into Australia of economic, social, cultural and sporting benefit, eg top managers, executives, specialists and technical workers, diplomats and other personnel of foreign governments, temporary business entry, working holiday makers, entertainers etc;
 - Temporary residents (including long-stay business visa holders) are generally sponsored by an Australian business or organisation to work in Australia as a skilled paid employee. Their initial stay in Australia is generally for more than 3 months but not more than 4 years; and
- ❑ Visitors
 - persons approved for entry into Australia for a temporary stay as tourists, business visitors, for the purpose of visiting relatives or obtaining medical treatment. Visitors are not normally permitted to engage in employment in Australia;

- Short-stay business visas have now been put back in the visitor category because their principal purpose of journey is more closely aligned to visitors than to temporary residents. These visas are granted to people on the basis that their principal purpose of journey is a short stay (up to 3 months) business visit. Their visit must be consistent with their business background and relate to their existing activities.

Permanent Entry Permit After Entry (PEPAE)/Permanent Resident Visa (PRV)

A provision under the Migration Act which enables persons who arrived as visitors, temporary residents or students to apply for a change of their status to permanent residents. From 1 September 1994 the procedure for applying for residence in Australia was changed from applying for a Permanent Entry Permit After Entry (PEPAE) to applying for a Permanent Resident Visa (PRV).

Classification of Countries and Regions

Statistics in this publication are classified to regions and countries based on the ABS *Australian Standard Classification of Countries for Social Statistics* (ASCCSS). The classification is based on the concept of geographic proximity. It groups neighbouring countries into broad geographic areas on the basis of their similarity in terms of social, cultural, economic and political characteristics.

The country classification used in this report is listed on page 41. In the tables in this publication some minor groups have been combined due to space limitations. For further information about ASCSS and for copies of the classification please contact the ABS.

Australia and External Territories

Following amendments to Section 17(a) of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901 - 1973 effective 1 July 1992, the territories of Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands now form part of geographic Australia. The Jervis Bay Territory has always been a territory in its own right, and following self-government for the ACT it is no longer included with the ACT for statistical purposes. These three territories are classified as the ninth state/territory of Australia.

Australian External Territories comprises the statistical units of Norfolk Island and Other Australian External Territories.

Former USSR and the Baltic States

Because, *Former USSR and the Baltic States nfd* accounts for a high proportion of total Former USSR and the Baltic States, the separate figures for component countries are likely to be understated and should be used with caution. For example, the 'not further defined' component comprised 72 per cent of total settler arrivals born in the Former USSR and the Baltic States in the financial year 1999-00.

Ethiopia and Eritrea

Caution is also required when using data for Ethiopia. This figure may include arrivals born in Eritrea since settlers who reported Ethiopia as their country of birth were coded as such, despite the fact that they may have been born in what is now called Eritrea.

Inclusion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Population

In 1967 Australia passed a referendum which meant that 'full-blooded Aborigines' were not excluded from population counts. Following this, population estimates were backdated to 1961 to include this component of the population.
