Contributory Parent (Migrant) Visa (From Subclass 173 to 143)

Application Document Checklist

This checklist is for holders of a Contributory Parent (Temporary) visa (subclass 173) who want to make an application for a Contributory Parent (Migrant) visa (subclass 143) to reside permanently in Australia.

Original documents should not be provided unless requested. Please provide 'certified copies' of original documentation. Documents not in English must be accompanied by accredited English translations.

You should ensure that you lodge a completed visa application. While the department may ask you to provide more information to determine whether you meet the criteria for grant of the visa, a decision on the visa application may be made solely on the information provided at the time of application.

Note: The Visa Application Charge (VAC) will not be refunded if a decision is made to refuse to grant the visa because the applicant did not satisfy the criteria for grant of the visa.

Personal documents	✓
One recent passport-size photograph (45mm x 35mm) of yourself and any other person included in this application. This should be of the head and shoulders only, and should show the person facing the camera and against a plain background. You should print the name of the person on the back of each photograph.	
Other personal documents Note: Only required if there has been a change in circumstances since you were granted a Contributory Parent (Temporary) visa.	✓
If you have arrived in Australia (since being granted a Contributory Parent (Temporary) visa), certified copies of the passports or travel documents you, your partner and your dependants used to enter Australia, and of any passports held since then.	
Certified copies of birth certificates showing both parents' names for you and any other person included in the application. If you do not have a birth certificate and are unable to get one, you must provide a certified copy of the identification pages of at least one of the following documents: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • passport • family book showing both parents' names • identification document issued by the government • documents issued by a court that verifies your identity. If you are unable to provide one of these documents, you must provide other acceptable evidence that you are who you claim to be.	
If any person included in the application is, or has been married, certified copies of the marriage certificate(s).	
If any person included in the application has been permanently separated, divorced or widowed, a certified copy of the statutory declaration/separation certificate, divorce decree absolute or the death certificate of the deceased partner (as appropriate).	
If any person included in the application has changed his or her name (eg by marriage or deed poll), a certified copy of evidence of the name change.	
If any child included in the application is adopted, certified copies of the adoption papers.	
Certified copies of documents to verify custody and access arrangements for children under 18 years of age (unless both parents are included in the application.)	
If any person included in the application has served in the armed forces of any country, certified copies of military service record or discharge papers.	
Certified copies of birth certificates for all your children not included in the application (showing names of both parents) or the family book (showing names of both parents).	
Evidence of where all your children reside (for example passport, citizenship or residence certificate).	
Evidence of your relationship to your sponsor.	
Evidence that the sponsor is a settled Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or eligible New Zealand citizen.
