## Medical Treatment Visa (Subclasses 675 and 685)

### Application Document Checklist

Do not provide original documents unless requested. You should provide certified copies of original documentation. Documents not in English must be accompanied by accredited English translations.

You should ensure that you lodge a completed visa application. While the department may ask you to provide more information in order to determine whether you meet the criteria for grant of the visa, a decision on the visa application may be made solely on the information provided at the time of application.

**Note:** The Visa Application Charge will not be refunded if a decision is made to refuse to grant the visa because the applicant did not satisfy the criteria for grant of the visa.

<b>Forms, fees and charges</b>	✓
A completed application form: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Applicants applying from outside Australia must complete form 48ME. <b>See:</b> <a href="#">Form 48ME</a> <i>Application to visit Australia for medical treatment</i></li><li>• Applicants applying in Australia must complete form 601. <b>See:</b> <a href="#">Form 601</a> <i>Application for further stay as a visitor</i></li></ul>

<b>Personal documents</b>	✓
Certified copies of passport or travel documents of all people included in the application	
Four recent passport sized photographs (45mmx35mm) of you and any other person included in the application <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• these should be of the head and shoulders only against a plain background</li> <li>• print the name of the person on the back of each photograph.</li> </ul>	
For all applicants under 18 years of age, written confirmation that any parent or guardian not travelling with the child consents to the grant of a visa.	
<b>Other documents</b>	✓
If you are seeking treatment or organ donation in Australia you will need to provide: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A letter from the treating doctor in Australia outlining your medical condition and the treatment that will be required, including an estimate of the timeframe and cost of this treatment.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Evidence you have sufficient funds to support yourself and any accompanying person while in Australia. This should include letters from any Australians who will be supporting you during your stay.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A letter from the treating doctor or hospital saying they are satisfied with arrangements for payment.</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If you are going to be treated in a public hospital, the letter about payment arrangements needs to come from the state or territory health authority and should also confirm that no Australian will be disadvantaged in accessing medical services as a result of your treatment.</li> </ul>	
<b>Health documents</b>	✓
All applicants are required to meet the health requirements in order to be granted a visa. <b>See:</b> <a href="#">Health requirements</a>	
<b>Character documents</b>	✓
All applicants must meet character requirements. <b>See:</b> <a href="#">Character and penal clearance requirements</a>
